


Sweet & Sassy Sweetheart PJ Party

Super fun music and dances get the girls moving and grooving to some fun tunes!




Daddy Daughter Dance 3/3/1-




Festive attire added to the fun atmosphere at the event.

The City has on occasion allowed the display of art work in the Novi Civic Center building, as a way to promote arts and culture in the community and to add to the beauty of the Civic Center itself.

Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services (PRCS) was approached by the Art Institute of Michigan. a local creative arts college, to display art work from their qualified faculty and staff. PRCS created a program demo to show how art work can be displayed and viewed by the public in the Civic Center space. A variety of art work from the faculty and staff at Art Institute of Michigan is on loan to the City of Novi and will be displayed in the Novi Civic Center Atrium from March 5 to May 2, 2010. An opening reception will coincide with the opening of The Novi Theaters' performance of Anything Goes on March 5 and will run from 6 to 8pm.

Assuming that the program demo goes well, PRCS staff will continue to partner with the Art Institute of Michigan and other local art organizations to display art work in the Civic Center building in the future. Staff is preparing an Art Exhibition Policy and Art Exhibit Agreement to facilitate the display of art work, with uniform and consistent rules and an explanation of the various obligations of the exhibitor and the City with regard to such displays. SUBJECT: REDUCTION IN MUNICIPAL CREDITS

The City of Novi recently received a letter (see attached) from Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation (S.M.A.R.T.) informing us of a reduction in our Municipal Credits. These funds are provided by the State of Michigan to provide municipalities financial resources to assist in the operation of transit operations. Currently, we receive \$44,713 yearly from SMART to help subsidize the Senior Transportation program and the Subsidized Cab Program that is utilized daily by older adults and people with disabilities.

The reduction of credits for the City of Novi is \$1414.00 and will need to be repaid to the State. SMART will offset the amount due against the municipal Credits made available after July 2010 (next year) and show a reduction of this 2009 overpayment against the 2010 Municipal Credits.

SMART has also stated that next years allocations could also further impact future allocations.

Subject: Reduction In Municipal Credits Of \$ 1414.00

Municipal credits are funds which are provided by the state of Michigan to provide municipalities financial resources to assist in the operation of transit operations. SMART receives Municipal Credit funds from the State for further distribution to qualified programs in Southeast Michigan, making SMART the administrator for transportation program funds appropriated by the State. With the recent passage of all budgets by the State of Michigan, the Municipal Credit Program also received reductions. Particular to this program, the appropriation to our region of \$2.0 million was reduced by \$127,000.

According to the State, the reduction of \$127,000 is directly attributed to the \$9.8 million decline projected in Comprehensive Transportation Fund (CTF) revenue, where Municipal Credit appropriations reside. The reduction is shared by more than 90 Cities, Townships, and Villages (CTV's) in Macomb, Oakland, and Wayne counties. The Municipal Credits approved and made available by the state after July 1, 2009 (for the State budget year October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010) was based on the historic assumption that the \$2.0 million appropriation to the CTV's would not be reduced.

Based on the State allocation factors, your portion of the reduction is indicated in the subject line above and will need to be repaid to the state through SMART, as the administrator for this program. However, we understand that much of the Municipal Credit activity following July 2009 is established and/or currently in payout. Additionally, because the overall reduction of the \$127,000 is temporarily manageable, SMART will offset the amount due against your Municipal Credits made available after July 2010 (next year), and show a reduction of this 2009 overpayment against your 2010 Municipal Credits.

Please note that next year's allocations could be further impacted given the economic conditions facing the state. We can assure you that SMART is doing all it can to keep these programs growing, as your local transportation programs serve a necessary and important economic and social benefit in our region.

Novi Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services (PRCS) is currently seeking \$25,000 in funding from the Pepsi Refresh Everything Grant Program to fund arts programming in Fuerst Park. No matching funds are required.

The Pepsi Refresh grant program is currently looking for programs from non-profit organizations, local businesses, and individuals that impact the community in a positive way. The grants must fall into one of the following categories: health, arts and culture, food and shelter, the planet, neighborhoods, and education. The grants are awarded based on a month long voting period by the general public on Pepsi's website. The top ten vote getters in each available level of funding will receive awards.

Our voting period is the month of April. During that time we will publicize our need for votes in a variety of ways including, but not limited to cityofnovi.org, Facebook, Twitter, press releases, emails, the electronic sign. If funds are received we will receive notification at the beginning of May. If received, the funds be utilized toward the public sculpture exhibit and all supplemental programming associated with the program, the Sizzling Summer Arts Series program, and any other art programming taking place at Fuerst Park.

SUBJECT: THE LANDINGS GRANT APPLICATION - PUBLIC HEARING

Currently McKenna Associates and City staff are preparing a Michigan Natural Resource Trust Fund (MNRTF) development grant application through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) for The Landings property, to be submitted by the April 1, 2010 grant deadline.

The concept map (attached) of the initial development of the property, which includes; park infrastructure, a promenade walkway, a small fishing pier and landscaping. In addition, 2-3 accessible parking spaces will be incorporated into the concept design. The grant application requested will be for a total of approximately \$625,000.

A required part of the application process is to conduct a Public Hearing regarding the project application. The Public Hearing for The Landings MNRTF Grant Application will be held as a part of the March 11, 2010, Commission Meeting at 7pm. Public notice (attached) has been provided via various media outlets and via email to individuals that participated in the land use study. Upon the conclusion of the Public Hearing, the minutes will be submitted as a part of the grant application.

As a portion of the application, letters of support for the project must be included. Therefore, letters have been requested from various groups and stakeholders in the area and state for submission by March 12, 2010, that can be included in the application. This information will also available on the City website, along with a sample letter that individuals may utilize.

A draft of the grant application and the proposed funding sources are forthcoming.
