I am writing in support of the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Grant being submitted by the City of Novi for acquisition of property adjacent to the planned ITC Corridor Trail.

The City of Novi Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services Department plans to apply for a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF) grant to fund acquisition of property adjacent to the ITC Corridor Trail. The trail is depicted on the City's 2011 Non-Motorized Master Plan. It will provide a five-mile, non-motorized recreation link traversing the entire City of Novi from north to south. Ultimately, this trail will link regional facilities – such as Maybury Park and Hines Park – in the neighboring communities of Northville, Livonia and Westland with parks in Novi.

The Parks Recreation and Cultural Services (PRCS) Department's goal for this piece of property is to preserve the natural woodland and wetland habitat and extend the proposed ITC Trailhead Park on the southwest corner of Nine Mile and Garfield Roads.

I believe that the greatest asset of this property are the numerous wetlands that are scattered about underneath the forest canopy. For the majority of the residents living along Nine Mile Road between Napier Road and Beck Road who rely on drilled wells as their sole source of drinking water, the filtering actions of these wetlands are most important and should be protected to the greatest extent possible.

On several walks along the section of the ITC Trail that abuts this property, I have observed ponding in these wetland areas sometimes reaching 12-24 inches in depth. Two days later, these same wet areas were absorbed into the underlying soil and would most likely be filtered all the way to the first static water table which is located at a depth of 35 feet. Since most area residents cannot afford to tap into the city water supply running along either Nine Mile Road or Garfield Road, the filtering action of these wetlands could not be replaced if this property were developed.

I have also noted several varieties of reptiles both in the streams that drain into these wetlands and at various points along the ITC Trail. These small reptiles are

an important food source for the various waterfowl that reside on this property and if development were to take place, their habitat would be destroyed.

Again, I strongly support this development and request that the MNRTF board fully fund this project.
