Southeast Michigan has experienced repeated widespread flooding with **five flooding-related FEMA Federal Disaster Declarations since 2000**. This widespread flooding has resulted in economic burden and social hardship across southeast Michigan. The **Great Lakes Water Authority** and the **US Army Corps of Engineers Detroit District** have received authorization and federal funding from Congress to study flooding across the region and identify actions to help mitigate its impacts on our communities.
