A Letter from our WMHA President

Hello Whispering Meadows,

I hope this letter finds you in good health and spirits as we move through these uncharted territories and into this Holiday Season. All our common areas remain open for your enjoyment during the winter months. We hope to see the continued increase of walkers, joggers, and bikers throughout the neighborhood while the weather permits.

Your Board has continued to meet monthly in various safe ways to proceed with Association business. All the questions and comments which come to the Board get discussed at these meetings. Any decisions are communicated back to the resident.

I am happy to report 329 out of 338 homeowners (97.34%) have paid their 2020 dues. We no longer have any residents with more than one year in back dues. Paying on time reduces costs for the Association and allows us to pay for common services. The Board works hard to keep our association dues low. Currently our dues are \$85 per year which covers maintenance and improvements of all Common Areas, two entrances, electrical, insurance, mailings, association activities, legal, accounting, and professional fees. 2021 dues notices will go out in January for payment within 30 days.

I have attempted to schedule our Annual Board Meeting (open to the entire membership) for a Sunday in January or early February at the Novi Civic Center. Due to COVID unpredictability, rooms are being reserved on a biweekly basis. Please look for a meeting announcement on the sandwich boards at the entrances and on our Association Facebook page for any updates.

A big thank you to Nicole O'Neill for not only arranging the awesome bi-weekly food trucks (which recorded record numbers of customers for some trucks) but also for organizing the well-attended Halloween Scavenger Hunt!

If You See Something, Say Something

In recent months there have been a few circumstances that have prompted homeowners to keep their eyes and ears open for any suspicious activity. We spoke to the City of Novi Police Department and they recommend keeping all valuable possessions out of your vehicles and to



lock your vehicles at all times. They also recommend installing video cameras around your home if needed. If you will be away from your home consider putting motion censored lights on your home and leaving a few lights on inside your home. Most importantly if you see any suspicious activity call the police immediately, check on your neighbors frequently, and stav diligent in your surroundings. We are incredibly grateful for our Whispering Meadows community and take pride in knowing how safe it is.

Winter is Upon Us

As you prepare for the winter months ahead please keep these handy tips in mind.

- 1. Remove vehicles from the streets to ensure that all roadways are properly and safely plowed.
- 2. Clean and inspect your chimney out before having your first indoor winter fire.
- 3. Safely secure all outdoor furniture from the elements.
- 4. As you try and stay warm please remember these ordinances from the City of Novi in regards to open outdoor fires:
- -All fires must be kept in a metal outdoor fireplace or some other non-combustible container.
- -You may only use seasoned dry fire wood.
- -All fire pits must be kept at least 50' from any structure (house, garage, fence, deck, etc.)
- -Provide a means that will keep the fire from spreading (garden hose, shovels, etc.).
- -Be in attendance of the fire at all times.
- -Completely extinguish the fire when done.
- -Under no circumstances can trash or yard waste/debris (leaves, twigs, branches, etc.) be burned.
- 5. Safely clear your roof from any debris.
- 6. Seal any windows or doors that may be allowing cold air in.
- 7. Always check on your elderly neighbors and ask if they need any help with shoveling and/or any other assistance.






Did You Know?
