The building in front of -- the 6 picture in front of us now faces the east 7 elevation? 8 MR. MEININGER: That's correct. 9 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: And you're also looking for an additional wall 10 11 sign of 65.5 square feet on the north and 12 west elevations of the store. 13 MR. MEININGER: That's correct. 14 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: You're 15 only allowed one. That's what the challenge 16 is for tonight? 17 MR. MEININGER: Yes. 18 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: 19 have anything else to offer, gentlemen? 20 MR. MEININGER: You know, this 21 store front elevation is a rack logo. You 22 know, the ACM. The big box, the lettering is 23 residing on a metal finished detailed sign 24 that is synonomous with The Rack stores 25 across the nations. It's considered a

company logo.

You know, the other two elevations are -- they're smaller and, you know, for retailers, you know, exposure and being able to be seen, you know, it's a huge -- it's a huge element for a retailer. And I know that I'm always challenged as I go across the country building stores that, you know, the merchants are always saying, where is our signage, you know, how come we are not there, how come we are not here, and can we see that the idea is to be seen, you know, as much as they can.

CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Okay. Is there anyone -- anything else, gentlemen, that you would like to add?

MR. GALLENTIN: Ross Gallentin, Ramco Gershenson.

One thing to keep in mind is Nordstrom Rack store, how far off it is Novi Road. It's not right up against it. We are not 50 feet off. We're close to 1,000 feet back. If you look at Gander Mountain that was done and got the variance for the big signs back and front.

Page 11 1 So it's really important for 2 us people to know where Nordstrom Rack is off 3 of Novi Road. Therefore, that's one of the 4 reasons we are asking for the signage on the 5 size. 6 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Is there 7 anyone in the audience that wishes to make comment on this case? 8 9 (No audible responses.) CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Seeing 10 11 none, Mr. Secretary is there any 12 correspondence? MR. FERRELL: Yes, Madam Chair. 13 14 Seventeen letters sent, zero letters 15 returned, zero approval letters received, 16 zero objection letters received. 17 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Building 18 department? 19 MR. BOULARD: Nothing to add, 20 other than the fact that I did have a 21 conversation with the gentlemen regarding the 22 requirement for the mock sign. 23 And due to the face there was 24 no building to put it on, they provided the color rendition and substitute. 25

3	CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: I noticed
4	that when I went out. Thank you.
5	Board members?
6	MR. BYRWA: I got a question.
7	Are these going to be illuminated signs?
8	MR. MEININGER: Yes, sir, LED
9	illuminated.
10	MR. BYRWA: I think the size is a
11	good size. It's probably less than
12	10 percent of the overall elevation of the
13	building. You're not overpowering the
14	building with signage. I would be voting for
15	it. It looks good.
16	CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Anyone
17	else?
18	MR. MONTVILLE: Madam Chair, if I
19	could?
20	CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Yes,
21	Member Montville?
22	MR. MONTVILLE: For the
23	additional size of the 189 square feet, it
24	seems like a good amount for professional due
25	diligence went in to come up with that

Page 13 1 number. 2 Can you spend a second or two 3 to give us some bullet points on where you got 189, why you didn't want to go 4 5 potentially smaller or bigger? 6 MR. Anyone else for comment? Would the board like to 21 22 entertain a motion? 23 MR. MONTVILLE: I'm prepared to 24 make a motion at this time, Madam Chair. 25 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Go ahead,

Member Montville.

MR. MONTVILLE: In Case
PZ15-0047, submitted by Nordstrom Rack,
specifically, Robert Ryan on behalf of
Callison Architecture, the architect on the
project, I move that we grant the variances
sought by the petitioner for the following
reasons: The signage and the size of the 189
square feet on the east side of the building
is required in order to get proper visibility
for the business, a smaller sign would
potentially have a negative economic impact
for the business. Additionally, to the north
and west exposures of the building.

There is a unique aspect of this particular unit, within the development, having that exposure, which is a unique circumstance relative to the other tenants within the building.

The relief is consistent with the spirit of the ordinance, given the due diligence and professionalism that would go into the signs and they are the minimum size for the requested variance, as reflected by the applicants and the process they put into

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1	the design of the three signs.
2	So with that said, I move
3	that we grant the variances as requested.
4	MS. KRIEGER: Second.
5	CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: It's been
6	moved and seconded. Any further discussion?
7	(No audible responses.)
8	CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Seeing

MEININGER: We are excited. 6 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: We are 7 excited to have you. When will you be open? 8 MR. MEININGER: September 1st. 9 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Moving right along. 10 11 Our second case of the 12 evening, Infinity of Novi. Case No. 13 PZ15-0049. 14 Stanley Tkacz, I believe, of 15 Studio Design on behalf of Infinity of Novi, 16 24355 Haggerty Road, west of Haggerty and south of Grand River. 17 18 The applicant is requesting a variance for the City of Novi to allow 19 20 installation of additional signage in form of 21 a five foot square foot brand sign on the 22 three existing wall signs. Each are 23 currently approved and installed through a 24 previous variance, previous ZBA cases for 25 signage.

Page 17 1 Good evening. And you are? 2 MR. TKACZ: Good evening, ladies 3 and gentlemen. I am Stanley Tkacz, Studio 4 5 Design, representing the Suburban Collection 6 here this evening as related to the request 7 for the sign variance. 8 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Would you 9 please spell your last name and be sworn in by our secretary. 10 11 MR. TKACZ: T, as in Tom, K as in 12 kangaroo, A, as in apple, C as a Charlie, Z as in zoo loo. 13 14 MR. FERRELL: Do you swear to tell the truth in the case -- testimony you 15 16 are about to give in this case? 17 MR. TKACZ: Yes, sir. MR. FERRELL: Go ahead and 18 19 proceed. 20 MR. TKACZ: I believe you have in 21 front of you a little brochure that was 22 handed to you with everything on it, the 23 drawings. It's very self-explanatory. 24 What this request is relating 25 to is that in completing the new facility,

Page 18 Infinity, like all automobile manufacturers 1 2 have, corporate identities requested in their 3 graphics program. 4 The one that we have not put 5 in is this little five foot sign that is 6 adjacent directly to the main entrance, only 7 five foot off the floor line or the ridge 8 line in the process. 9 It is a stainless steel non-illuminated element. That's why we here 10 11 this evening. 12 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Would you 13 mind putting your renderings on the overhead for everyone to see, please. 14 15 MR. TKACZ: Where the sign would 16 go is adjacent to this door, in this location 17 here. This is a -- it's similar to 18 19 a facility that we have installed in Troy, it 20 has the sign adjacent to the side door. 21 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Is there 22 anything else that you would like to add to 23 your testimony in this evening? 24 MR. TKACZ: No, ma'am. 25 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Is there

TKACZ: It's what goes with 16 the corporate image that when you see it 17 driving down the street, when you park your car, you see it, when you walk up with the 18 19 front door, you see it. 20 It's that perpetual graphic 21 program, again, all automobile manufacturers 22 They have got to be stuck in have them. 23 front of your nose no matter what you do. 24 MR. SANGHVI: Thank you. 25 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Anyone

Page 21 1 else? Member Montville? 2 MR. MONTVILLE: If I could, just 3 to confirm I got the impression that that design also complimented the interior design 4 5 in your front lobby, which obviously was a 6 pretty expensive build-out, and would it be 7 fair to say that that's part of the branding 8 that all would be -- the branding package in 9 full of what you're trying to present? MR. TKACZ: That's correct, sir. 10 11 That's part the branding package. 12 Open it up to my fellow board 13 members. 14 CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Thank 15 you. 16 Member Ferrell? 17 MR. FERRELL: Madam Chair, thank 18 you. 19 I just don't see how adding a 20 symbol by the door is really going to impact 21 their business, make it any different. 22 already have three signs. 23 MR. SANGHVI: I'm having a hard 24 time hearing you. 25 I will speak up for MR. FERRELL:

I don't see how adding that sign by the door is really going to make that much of a difference to their business, when they already have three signs. If you are in the parking lot, you know why you are there. You know what the business is.

Unfortunately, I don't think I'd be supporting this sign.

CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: I have a question for you.

So on the building and the picture that you have before us, there is an Infinity brand sign in the upper right-hand corner of the picture.

So how does that differ from what you're putting at the door or is that sign -- are any of these other signs coming down that we granted variances for?

MR. TKACZ: No. This is an additional sign from the perspective, from a personal level elevation as you approach the main building entrance. But it's the Infinity emblem with the word Infinity underneath it. That's a stainless steel,

non-illuminated, flat mounted to the wall.

CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: I have a hard time with this. I understand what corporates want. And I can appreciate, you know, we want to support all the businesses, but I don't know that -- my feeling is that it doesn't serve a purpose, it doesn't meet the criteria. That's my concern.

When I was reviewing this, I could see it, but then it wouldn't be the right thing to do, but if the Infinity sign wasn't up in the corner of that building, then you would need something to say Infinity, I agree, however, I don't see where that's going to add to -- it's not for identification from a distance. It's not that the business can't be identified.

For me, it doesn't meet the criteria for a variance at this time. That's my personal opinion. I will wait for the other board members to echo their comments.

Member Krieger?

MS. KRIEGER: I agree with that, but I also see from the business side of it, that people on Iphones all the time, once

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they grab your attention and you're entering the building, or the place where the building is at, you see Infinity, here I am, and then as you're walking in, you could be on your phone and look up and why am I here, and there is nothing on the door, so that emblem confirms or draws the person in, and there is Infinity written there, but it's smaller so it's more the emblem as the sign than verbiage. It's a minimal sign, so I'm okay with it. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: Thank you. Anyone else?

MR. MONTVILLE: Madam Chair, if I may.

One factor, given the small size, and it is unique, it's not on the main exterior of the building, but it's part of the entrance, I am confident this isn't going to have any negative impact on any surrounding areas while still having a positive economic impact to the business, again from a branding perspective.

Infinity is selling their product to -- they're competing with other

elevated brands, whether it be Mercedes Benz or Jaguar, there is an element of appeal and if you look at the interior of the building, the way they built it out, obviously on the exterior there is a lot of due diligence, professionalism financing that went into that, for a five foot sign I think is not going to have a negative impact, but have a potential strong potential positive impact into Member Krieger's point, a lot of the online -- as they see -- even when you are checking in on Google maps, whatnot, identifying the front door of businesses.

Keeping that in mind, they don't have any signage at the front main entrance of their business. I think that's something else to consider.

So with that said, I would concur with Member Krieger. At this point I am in favor of the request.

CHAIRPERSON GRONACHAN: All right. Anyone else?

Would anyone like to make a motion? Member Krieger.

MS. KRIEGER: I move that we

grant the variance in Case No. PZ15-0049, sought by the petitioner for Infinity.

That the petitioner has shown a practical difficulty, requiring attraction to their business that they have renovated and they do have minimum signage instead of all three signs, having signs as I drove by, that it is -- as minimum as they can do it.

And without the variance, petitioner will unreasonably prevent it, limit it with respect to the use of their property for their due diligence and justice to have signage at their entrance and not over their door on the Haggerty side.

That property is unique because of its location and the other three businesses on the neighboring sites.

The petitioner did not create the condition because of its location already.

The relief granted will not unreasonably interfere with adjacent or surrounding properties because it's a minimum emblem that will not cause injustice to the neighbors.
