BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Summerlin of Novi Homeowners Association is requesting a standard overhead street light at the entrance to the subdivision located off of West Park Drive, south of Pontiac Trail. The Resolution for Amended Street Light Policy adopted September 24, 2012 states that the City will provide one standard overhead street light in the public right-of-way at major road entrances of residential developments, such as Summerlin, to enhance public safety. The policy also states that if the distance between the proposed streetlight and the source of electricity is greater than 100 feet, the Association is responsible for the costs associated with the additional distance. The ongoing operation and energy costs for the street light will be paid for by the City.

Engineering staff worked with Detroit Edison to determine the appropriate locations for street lights and to obtain estimated installation and ongoing operation costs. The new street light will be an underground fed LED fixture on a 30' black fiberglass pole.

In order to facilitate installation of the street lights, Detroit Edison Company is requesting approval and execution of the attached Purchase Agreement. The Detroit Edison agreement requires the City to pay the total installation cost of \$6,363.58 and an ongoing annual lamp charge of \$329.56 for operation and maintenance of the street light. As with all other street light installations, the City requires payment by the applicant for all reimbursable charges and the City pays Detroit Edison directly.

A second agreement between the City and Summerlin of Novi Homeowners Association is also provided for consideration to formalize the payment of the installation at Summerlin. The Association has paid \$3,170.31 for the additional costs related to the electrical extension and the City would pay \$3,193.37 for a total installation cost of \$6,363.58. The Street Light Policy stipulates that the City will pay for ongoing energy costs of the light at the intersection with Beck Road. The following table summarizes the costs for the requested streetlight:

Re: DTE Energy - Purchase Agreement for Municipal Street Lighting Summerlin of Novi Site Condominium

Dear Mr. Coburn:

We have received and reviewed the Purchase Agreement for Municipal Street Lighting (Work Order 44540863) for an entranceway light at the intersection of Summerlin Blvd., and West Park Drive. The Subdivision Association will pay the cost for an upgrade in the street light.

The Purchase Agreement is a standard form agreement prepared by The Detroit Edison Company ("DTE") for use in projects for installation and maintenance of new street lighting. It references and incorporates the terms of the Master Agreement for Municipal Street Lighting entered into between the City and DTE Energy on March 4, 2013, The Master Agreement controls the terms of installation and maintenance, generally, such as terms of payment, rates, maintenance responsibilities, term, liability, warranties and general contract provisions, including such things as choice of law and notices.

The Purchase Agreement includes the more specific information relating to each particular project, including total estimated project cost, project location, project specifications, and special order information.

The terms of the Master Agreement apply to each Purchase Agreement for individual projects. The Master Agreement was previously revised to satisfactorily address an issue we raised with the liability provisions in the Agreement. Brian Coburn, Engineering Manager April 29, 2016 Page 2

The Purchase Agreement and Master Street Lighting Agreement are in DTE's standard format and we see no legal impediment to approval of the agreements.

The Summerlin of Novi Homeowners Association has agreed to pay the upgrade cost for decorative streetlights, while the City will pay the ongoing energy costs relating to the street lights. We see no legal impediment to entering into the modified version of the Agreement and the terms of the Agreement are consistent with the City's Street Lighting Policy.

Purchase Agreement

This Purchase Agreement (this "<u>Agreement</u>") is dated as of April 12, 2016 between The Detroit Edison Company ("<u>Company</u>") and City of Novi ("<u>Customer</u>").

This Agreement is a "Purchase Agreement" as referenced in the Master Agreement for Municipal Street Lighting dated March 4, 2013 (the "<u>Master Agreement</u>") between Company and Customer. All of the terms of the Master Agreement are incorporated herein by reference. In the event of an inconsistency between this Agreement and the Master Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall control.

Customer requests the Company to furnish, install, operate and maintain street lighting equipment as set forth below:

If "Yes" is checked, Customer and Company agree to the following additional terms.

A. Customer acknowledges that all or a portion of the Equipment is special order materials ("<u>SOM</u>") and not Company's standard stock. Customer will purchase and stock replacement SOM and spare parts. When replacement equipment or spare parts are installed from Customer's inventory, the Company will credit Customer in the amount of the then current material cost of Company standard street lighting equipment.

B. Customer will maintain an initial inventory of at least <u>0</u> posts and <u>0</u> luminaires and any other materials agreed to by Company and Customer, and will replenish the stock as the same are drawn from inventory. Costs of initial inventory are included in this Agreement. The Customer agrees to work with the Company to adjust inventory levels from time to time to correspond to actual replacement material needs. If Customer fails to maintain the required inventory, Company, after 30 days' notice to Customer, may (but is not required to) order replacement SOM and Customer will reimburse Company for such costs. Customer's acknowledges that failure to maintain required inventory could result in extended outages due to SOM lead times.

C. The inventory will be stored at ______. Access to the Customers inventory site must be provided between the hours of 9:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday with the exceptions of federal Holidays. Customer shall name an authorized representative to contact regarding inventory: levels, access, usage, transactions, and provide the following contact information to the Company:

The Customer will notify the Company of any changes in the Authorized Customer Representative. The Customer must comply with SOM manufacturer's recommended inventory storage guidelines and practices. Damaged SOM will not be installed by the Company.

D. In the event that SOM is damaged by a third party, the Company may (but is not required to) pursue a damage claim against such third party for collection of all labor and stock replacement value associated with the damage claim. Company will promptly notify Customer as to whether Company will pursue such claim.

E. In the event that SOM becomes obsolete or no longer manufactured, the Customer will be allowed to select new alternate SOM that is compatible with the Company's existing infrastructure.

F. Should the Customer experience excessive LED equipment failures, not supported by LED manufacturer warrantees, the Company will replace the LED equipment with other Company supported Solid State or High Intensity Discharge luminaires at the Company's discretion. The full cost to complete these replacements to standard street lighting equipment will be the responsibility of the Customer.

12. Experimental Emerging Lighting Technology ("EELT") Terms:

All or a portion of the Equipment consists of EELT: (check one) XES NO

If "Yes" is checked, Customer and Company agree to the following additional terms.

A. The annual billing lamp charges for the EELT equipment has been calculated by the Company are based upon the estimated energy and maintenance cost expected with the Customer's specific pilot project EELT equipment.

B. Upon the approval of any future MPSC Option I tariff for EELT street lighting equipment, the approved rate schedules will automatically apply for service continuation to the Customer under Option 1 Municipal Street Lighting Rate, as approved by the MPSC. The terms of this paragraph B replace in its entirety <u>Section 7</u> of the Master Agreement with respect to any EELT equipment purchased under this Agreement.

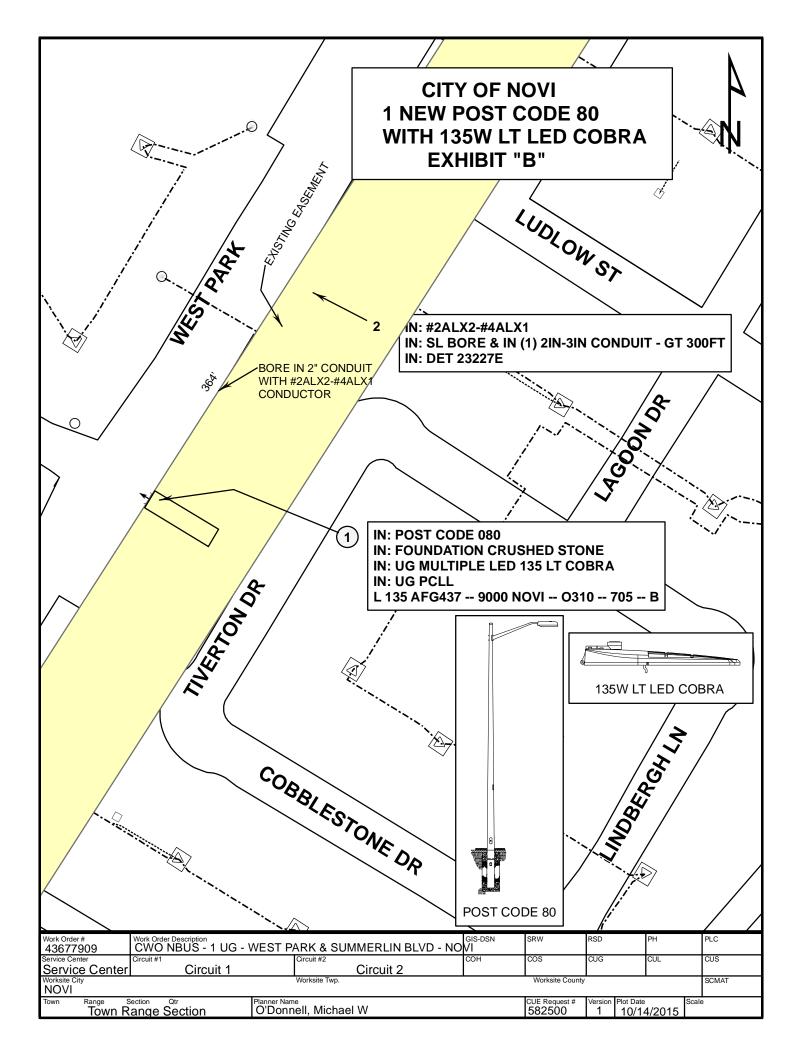

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this ____day of _____, 20___, by and between the CITY OF NOVI, a Michigan municipal corporation, whose address is 45175 W. Ten Mile Road, Novi, Michigan 48375 (the "City"), and Summerlin of Novi Homeowners' Association, a domestic non-profit corporation, ("Association") whose address is 44882 Lindbergh, Novi, MI 48377.

RECITATIONS:

The Association is the entity designated by the By-laws of the Summerlin of Novi Homeowners' Association to administer the affairs of said subdivision.

The Association has requested the City to assist it in making a certain local public improvement consisting of the installation of a street light at West Park Dr. and Summerlin Blvd., as described and depicted on the attached Exhibit A hereto.

The Board of the Association has authorized the president of the Association to execute this Agreement.

The City has obtained from the Detroit Edison Company ("DTE") an estimate for the installation and annual operation of said streetlight of \$6,363.58 and an operating cost for the first year in the amount of \$329.56 ("Annual Operating Cost").

The City has agreed to assist the Association in facilitating the installation and operation of said street light with DTE.

Due to the location of the proposed street light within the public right-of-way DTE requires that the City be billed for the Annual Operating Cost.

The parties desire to enter into this Agreement to provide for the payment by the City of the Annual Operating Cost, for which the City will be billed by DTE directly.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. To the extent that DTE may require, the City shall contract with DTE for the installation and operation of the proposed decorative streetlight.

2. Upon execution of this Agreement, or when requested by DTE, whichever occurs first, the Association shall pay directly to DTE the upgrade cost of \$3,170.21 (the "Upgrade Cost"), or such other amount as DTE shall require for installation of the CIAC over 100 feet.

The Association shall have the right to review and approve the final Upgrade Cost prior to commencing installation of the decorative street lights and shall have the option to cancel installation in the event that the Upgrade Cost exceeds \$3,170.21 by more than 10%. The Upgrade Cost is the only cost that will be incurred by the Association pursuant to this Agreement.

3. Upon payment of the installation cost, the City shall assume responsibility for ongoing energy costs associated with said street light for perpetuity.

4. The parties acknowledge that the payments are based upon estimates of charges imposed by DTE for the lighting service provided, and that the charges imposed by DTE may increase due to unforeseen circumstances.

5. The execution of this Agreement by the President of the Association constitutes affirmative representation of the members of the Board of the Association that he has been granted the power by the by-laws of the Association to act on behalf of the co-owners of the condominium to enter into this Agreement.

6. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties, and to statement, promises, or inducement made by either party or agent of either party that is not contained in this written contract shall be valid or binding; and this contract may not be enlarged, modified or altered except in writing signed by both parties and endorsed hereon.

7. The term of this Agreement shall be for twenty (20) years, and shall automatically renew for additional five (5) years periods thereafter, until such time as either party shall notify the other in writing of its intent not to renew. Such notice of intent not to renew shall be given not less than one year prior to the expiration of the original and any renewal terms.

8. This Agreement shall be binding on all heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
