Community Beautification Update

2023 marks the final stretch of the Willowbrook Community Association's 3-year focus on beautification upgrades, with special attention to Subdivision 3! Here is a recap of recent happenings and information on future proposals.

Subdivision 1: All main projects are done as of last spring! The two small informational signs approved for the Willow Ct and Millstream islands will be installed this year.

Subdivision 2: All projects complete! Thanks to volunteers last fall, we now have benches on three islands and the educational sign on the Malott island! We have received feedback that there still is interest in adding one more tree to the Malott island. To quote a neighbor, the one new oak tree is nice, but an additional tree will "add to the park feeling." In the upcoming General Meeting, we will review the current Malott layout and vote on adding a tree within a small garden.

Subdivision 3: Subdivision 3 is unique as it does not have WCA-maintained properties, but borders the city-maintained Brookfarm Park. The most popular area of interest from the Subdivision 3 summer survey was promoting the **Novi FREE Public Right of Way Tree Planting (248-735-5640 or ksalowich@cityofnovi.org).** After that program was publicized in the last newsletter, the City of Novi Forester reported an increase in WCA residents signing up for free trees – awesome! The next most popular survey response was getting a community library. We asked the city if we could add a little library and/or add landscaping to the entrances of Brookfarm Park. While landscaping was a concern due to maintenance, the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department in conjunction with the Novi Public Library are working together to get a "Read Box" added to Willowbrook Dr entrance to Brookfarm Park! Details are in the works, but the Novi Public Library will be servicing the box weekly from May through October. WCA will be holding a Book Drive to donate to the library's special collection that it uses for all Read Boxes in Novi – please see the newsletter for more details and donate if you are able! In the survey there was moderate interest in the Neighbors Helping Neighbors program. This also is a possibility that could improve the overall esthetics of Subdivision 3 and build connections between neighbors. In the February General Meeting, we will be presenting any necessary proposals for voting related to the Brookfarm Park Read Box and to the Subdivision 3 Neighbors Helping Neighbors.

As we get more details, the final proposals will be created and shared on our website and on the unofficial Facebook page at least a week before the meeting. If you do not have internet access and/or would like a hardcopy of the proposals, a board member can help provide a printout. We are excited for what 2023 will bring!
